

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the points of difference of a preschool education for your child at Moama Anglican Grammar?

Our Early Learning Centre, and Preschool offering, will be conveniently located on the same site as our Kindergarten to Year 12 school. This proximity provides Preschool children with access to our extensive school facilities beyond the footprint of the ELC, in addition to the ability to seamlessly integrate specialist teachers across music, the arts, languages, outdoor and physical education. These opportunities are unique points of difference of our Preschool offering that will significantly amplify learning and learner growth across the foundational years.

When will our Preschool open?

Our Preschool is currently under construction and will open in January 2027.

How are places prioritised in Preschool?

Where there is a waiting list for entry into Preschool, the School will, in the first instance, follow the Australian Government Priority of Access Guidelines. Subsequently, the waitlist considerations outlined in the School's Enrolment guidelines will be followed.

Services are required to give equal priority of access to:

- children who are at least 4 years old on or before 31 July in that preschool year and not enrolled or registered at a school,
- children who are at least 3 years old on or before 31 July in that preschool year and are:
 - children from low-income families
 - children with an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander background
 - children with disability or additional needs
 - children with English language needs
- children who are at risk of significant harm (from a child protection perspective).

Is there a uniform for Preschool students?

A Preschool uniform is currently being developed and will be available for purchase from the Moama Anglican Grammar Uniform Shop in the near future.

Why is there a cost difference between the preschool programs?

Moama Anglican Grammar is a not-for-profit service and sets fees after applying available government funding to reduce costs for families. Higher funding is provided for 4-year-old programs, which is why the cost of a 2-day 4-year-old program is lower than the 3-year-old program. The 4-day program for 4-year-olds has a higher daily rate because the same funding is spread across four days instead of two.

Will enrolment in the Preschool guarantee a place at Moama Anglican Grammar for Kindergarten?

Enrolment in the 4 day program is considered an entry point for a K-12 education, with a seamless transition to Kindergarten if your child is school ready. These children will be interviewed prior to starting preschool.

What is the Reggio Emilia Approach?

Reggio Emilia is an evidenced based approach to early years learning that sees children as capable, curious, and active participants in their world. It is a way of being, where children are always becoming, growing and evolving within a strong sense of belonging to a community. A key belief is "Nothing without joy", recognising that meaningful learning happens through engagement, wonder, and positive relationships.

Educators work alongside children as co-learners, building on their interests and ideas through intentional learning experiences. Learning is made visible through documentation, and children express their thinking through the "hundred languages", the many ways they communicate, create, and learn.
