

# 2027 Preschool Information Fact Sheet

## About Our Early Learning Centre

Moama Anglican Grammar's Early Learning Centre (ELC) is opening in 2027 at our Kirchhofer Street Campus and will provide a purpose-built, nurturing environment where our Preschool learners feel safe, valued, and supported.

Through a warm and inclusive approach, our dedicated educators will partner with families to honour each child's individuality while fostering curiosity, confidence, and a strong sense of belonging.

Inspired by the Reggio Emilia approach and aligned with the Early Years Learning Framework V2.0, our Preschool programs will support the development of essential social, emotional, physical, and cognitive skills, alongside early literacy and numeracy, laying strong foundations for a smooth and positive transition into primary school.

## Access to School Facilities

Preschool children will benefit from access to Moama Anglican Grammar's extensive facilities and resources, including incursions to our:

Children will participate in unique learning experiences facilitated by specialist staff such as:

- Physical Education (Fundamental Motor Skills)
- Outdoor and Environmental Education

Children will have strong connections with the Moama Anglican Grammar School community through special events such as; Easter Bonnet Parade, Book Week celebrations, and Science Week. Children who start school the following year will be involved in transition to school opportunities.

## Health & Safety

Our programs will follow best-practice standards in:

- Child Safety
- Supervision
- Child Safe Photography Guidelines
- Safe Arrival and Departure
- Immunisation requirements (or Medical Exemption documentation)
- Medical and Health Management
- Emergency and Evacuation Procedures
- Sun Protection
- Hygiene
- Nutrition

## Daily Structure

Each day, children will come together in small groups at various times to connect, share ideas, and reflect on their learning, building a strong sense of belonging and learning from one another.

The daily rhythm will balance literacy and numeracy experiences, intentional play, exploration, and specialist classes, alongside flexible eating times to support individual needs.

A calm rest period after lunch will provide time for sleep or quiet activities such as reading or listening to stories. At the end of the day, children will come together again to reflect on their experiences and share ideas for future learning.

## Communication

A digital platform will be used to share your child's experience through photos, videos, artwork, and learning stories, providing families with meaningful insight into their child's learning. Educators will regularly document and reflect on each child's progress, sharing highlights and key moments to support and extend their development.

## Class Sizes

Class groupings will be thoughtfully planned to support children's learning and wellbeing. A 1:10 educator-to-child ratio will be maintained, with qualified early childhood educators providing responsive, high-quality care, and individualised learning experiences. Specialist Primary staff will support learning program delivery.

## Toilet Training

We expect children to be toilet trained prior to starting Preschool. If your child is not yet toilet trained, please speak with the ELC Director to discuss your individual circumstances.

## Immunisation

Under the Public Health Act 2010, all children will be required to be fully immunised before starting early childhood education. Families will need to provide current immunisation documentation as part of the enrolment process.

If your child has a medical exemption, a completed AIR Immunisation Medical Exemption Form, signed by a medical practitioner, must be provided.

## Fees and Enrolment
